Additionally, they will retain the warehouse facility near Worthington to ensure lineworkers are strategically located for efficient service to members. This office update underscores the dedication to investing in long-term strategies to meet member needs. The upgraded facility in Slayton intends to enhance public-staff interactions, prioritize data security, and offer ample space for member and employee gatherings.

"Change is always somewhat scary, but we are trying to build that bridge between the past and the future while we transform outdated structures and systems into opportunities for technology and growth. We are always looking for ways to update our efficiencies while keeping our system current and working well for the future," says Tromblay. "The relatively close proximity of the main facilities in Worthington and Slayton to our membership presents an excellent opportunity to continue to easily serve the members in Nobles and Murray County," Tromblay expressed. "The new office space will align with the long-term energy efficiency strategy, focusing on improved coordination and communication as well as to be able to handle emergencies effectively for our region."

The office expansion \$\\$#39\$; design concept and architectural plans were crafted by architects and engineers from WiDSETH in Mankato, Minnesota.

Years Ago

Wilmont

Mrs. Emma Middendorff received a telegram from the War Department on Tuesday stating that her son, Pvt. Julius A. Middendorff was killed in action on Okinawa on May 18, 1945. Julius Anthony Middendorff was born at Breda, Iowa on June 26th, 1923 and was 21 years of age. When he was an infant the family moved to St. Kilian where they lived for three years and then came to Wilmont where they have since made their home. Before entering the services on September 14th, 1944, Julius was engaged in farming with his mother. He was sent to Camp Hood, Texas where he had seventeen weeks training and then came home on a week's furlough. On January 17th he was sent to Washington state and from there he was shipped overseas. Julius is survived by his mother, three brothers. Sgt. Arthur in Italy, Wilbert in St. Paul and Clarence at home, and four sisters, Adeline (Mrs. Joe Hartman), Rita of San Francisco, Cal., Leona and Marie at home. A brother, John, died in 1934, and his father, Anthony Middendorff, passed away April 30, 1937. Memorial services will be held at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church on Saturday, July 14th at nine o'clock with the Rev. Fr. Schimek officiating.

T. Sgt. Leo Spartz left Sunday for Hot Springs, Arkansas after spending a 30-day furlough with this parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Spartz and other relatives.

Pvt. Milo Hurlbut has been wounded in action according to word received here by his mother, Mrs. Alice Hurlbut. She also has been informed that he is now confined to a hospital on the Marianna's where he was flown by plane for treatment.

Ben Hippert received severe injuries Monday afternoon while hauling hay at his farm home. In an effort to stop a run-away team of horses he was knocked to the ground, the wagon going over him, causing a severe head wound, back and possible internal injuries. At the time of the accident the hay rack was half full of hay. He was immediately rushed to a Worthington hospital for emergency aid and where it required a great number of stitches to close the head wound. The latest report, however, is that he is resting satisfactory.

The Wilmont Farmer's Elevator held their annual meeting last Thursday evening at the school gym with a large crowd present. John Moser and Joe Balster resigned as directors and John Jueneman and Henry Slater were elected in their places for a term of three years. At the special meeting held Monday evening, N. D. Bertrand was reelected as president, Ray Johanning, vice-president, John Schettler, treasurer, and Paul Popkin, secretary. Fred Alberts was re-elected as manager and Matt Michels, Jr. as helper for another year.

Death came Tuesday of last week to John Vaske at LeMars, Iowa. He was 73 years old. He was born on a farm near New Vienna, Iowa on August 28, 1872 to Bernard and Mary Vaske. The Vaske family came to Remsen in the spring of 1883 where his father purchased the farm they were on. On June 25, 1902, he married Josephine Bohlke at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Remsen. The couple farmed on a couple of places before they purchased a farm south of Remsen in 1911, where they resided until they retired in November, 1942. Besides his widow, he is survived by 7 children - Ven. Sister M. (Callista) Fidelis of Dubuque; Cletus of Remsen, Mrs. Clarence (Malaine) Majeres of Wilmont, Mrs. Steve (Catherine) Bortscheller of LaMars, Mrs Leonard (Rosella) Majeres of Granville, Pfc. Alphonse Vaske who is with the Army in Germany, and Salvina at home. Mr. Vaske had several brothers and

sisters of whom but two remain. They are Mrs. Josephine Johanning of Wilmont and Mrs. G.J. Mensen of Adrian.


