Photo From the Past

The small camper turned into a popcorn stand was open every Wednesday and Saturday night when Wilmont had drawings for cash. The fire whistle would blow around 9 or 10 and names would be drawn. Those drawn had to be present. It was a great way to get area people to shop in Wilmont.




